#### June 18, 2014 Border Surge directed by Texas Leadership

"objective to decrease cartel drug and human smuggling by increasing patrol presence and the amount of smuggling events detected and interdicted"

June 23, 2014 Ground, air and marine saturation patrols began around-the-clock

Since June 23, 2014: The operation resulted in the seizure of \$1.87 billion worth of cartel drugs

### Rio Grande Valley (RGV)-specific success on apprehensions:

Week 1: 6,606 Illegal Aliens (IAs) apprehended

Week 11: Below 2,000 IAs apprehended

Week 28: 826 IAs apprehended (87% decrease since Week 1) Week 32: 1,583 IAs apprehended (76% decrease since Week 1)

## **TEXAS MILITARY DEPARTMENT (TMD): TEXAS NATIONAL GUARD (TXNG)**

July 21, 2014 Texas National Guard deployed to force of 1,000 on Texas Border

**January 2015:** Forces reduced to 200 troops

March 1, 2015: Hard deadline for funding to add or remove troops from Border March 31, 2015: Without additional funding, TXNG removed from Texas Border
